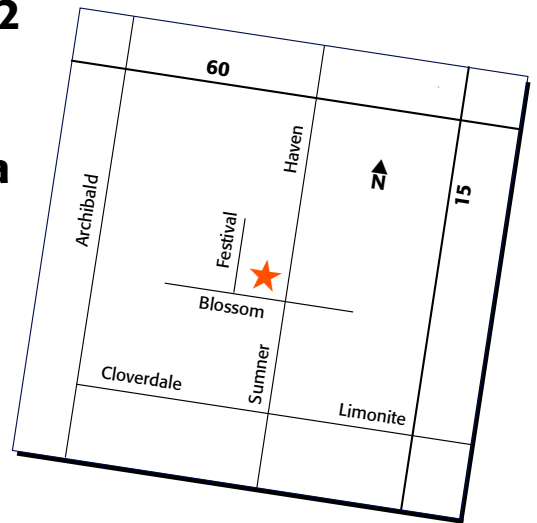

Who we are:

The Epilepsy Center is a non profit 501(c) (3). Our mission is "To raise awareness and educate the community about epilepsy and empower those who are affected by it." Since opening our doors in January of 2006, we have gone from servicing the County to servicing the entire Inland Empire. Some of the services that we currently provide are: parent and adult support groups, doctor and community referrals, 24hr helpline, conferences, a weekend camp, epilepsy educational classes for businesses and schools, IEP workshops, a quarterly newsletter, and current epilepsy literature.

What is Epilepsy:

Epilepsy is a neurological disorder that is caused by the misfiring of brain cells. It affects more than 3 million Americans. There are more people that suffer from epilepsy than those with Parkinson's disease, cerebral palsy, multiple sclerosis and muscular dystrophy, combined. Yet epilepsy is many times overlooked as well as misunderstood. It is very common for people with epilepsy to suffer from depression and to hide the fact that they suffer from the disorder. This is partially due to stigma and stereotypes that society still has about epilepsy. This silence needs to be broken.
