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Request for Proposal Self Determination Program

Published Date: 7/2/2024

Purpose:

This project provides additional support to navigate the Self Determination Program (SDP) process and help interested participants learn about the enrollment process and necessary steps to transition into the Self Determination Program. This project will also provide a variety of resources and service providers that are available to participants. The prospective applicant must demonstrate experience with successful event planning and must be able to work collaboratively with others (e.g., individuals served, families, regional center, LVAC).

Background Information:

Self Determination Local Volunteer Advisory Committees (LVAC) were established by law to provide oversight of the Self Determination Program (SDP) and make recommendations for improvement to each local regional center and the Department of Developmental Services. In Accordance with Welfare and Institutions (W&I) Code Section 4685.8(g), Inland Regional Center ("IRC"), has received funds from the Department of Developmental Services ("DDS") to support the implementation of the Self Determination Program ("SDP").

W&I Code section 4685.8(g) specifies these funds shall be used to maximize the ability of SDP participants to direct their own lives. DDS, in consultation with stakeholders, identified priority areas for the funding including:

- 1. Recruitment and training of independent facilitators.
- 2. Joint training for participants, families, regional centers, Local Volunteer Advisory Committee (LVAC) members and others.
- 3. Support or coaching in making the transition to SDP.
- 4. Assistance with spending plan development.
- 5. Orientation support which could include costs for speakers/presenters and development and modification of materials.
- 6. Collaborative groups/workshops to foster ongoing, shared learning and problem-solving opportunities.

Rate of Reimbursement: The rate of reimbursement for services will vary per project and individual need, and subject to review. Note the reimbursement rates must be identified by hourly

rates or project fees for the respective scope of work.

Proposals are being accepted for the following projects:

I. Self Determination Program Resource Fair

Plan and coordinate all activities related to developing an in-person Self Determination Resource Fair. This includes coordinating an event, creating exhibitor booth registration, and recruiting exhibitors that are SDP service providers serving the IRC catchment area for the resource fair. Provide translation of marketing materials and interpretation services (Spanish and American Sign Language (ASL)) at the event. The event must be held in San Bernardino or Riverside Counties. The project total includes funding for resource materials for attendees and gas cards (\$50.00) each, to be utilized to assist families in remote locations attend the resource fair. The awardee will work with IRC and the subcommittee to identify service providers, venues, etc., and will report updates on their progress.

II. 1:1 Self Determination Program Participant Coaching

The selected organization will provide participants with individualized support from experienced coaches. This service will assist participants transitioning to SDP, current participants needing ongoing support, and assist with the annual renewal process. This may include support in areas such as navigating the requirements of SDP, education and guidance on the process, person-centered planning, deciding which Financial Management Service (FMS) model is the best fit for a participant, assistance with spending plan development, finding services, spending plan renewal development, suggestions for recruiting and hiring employees, etc. Coaches will provide support to participants and at their request, collaborate with the service coordinator and/or Participant Choice Specialists.

Coaches should be knowledgeable about navigating the Self Determination program and be prepared to provide services to individuals whose native language is other than English. Proposals that include bilingual coaches are encouraged. Additional responsibilities will include providing monthly data collection and reporting with demographic information. The awardee will provide an outreach plan to reach out to IRC participants in the IRC catchment area, including rural communities.

III. Self Determination Support Group(s) with Technology Supports

This project provides a Self-Determination support group for participants interested in learning more about SDP. The support group will meet to provide education and guidance to ensure

participants have the skills and or resources needed to effectively use the SDP to achieve life goals. Meeting topic discussions may include the steps for enrollment, program requirements, budget renewals and other topics related to the SDP.

The support group meetings may be held virtually and/or in-person with a virtual option. Training in technology, including the use of devices, emailing, scanning, and other skills will be part of the project. An outreach plan will be developed to reach participants in the IRC catchment area, including rural communities. At least one support group meeting per month will be provided to support SDP participants and answer general SDP questions.

Eligible Applicants:

Both non-profit and proprietary organizations are eligible to apply. Employees of Regional Centers and the State of California are not eligible to apply. Applicants must disclose any potential conflicts of interest per Title 17 Section 54500. The applicant must secure and maintain their own liability insurance at the time of RFP being awarded.

Evaluation and Selection Procedures:

All proposals received by the deadline will be reviewed and scored by the LVAC. Proposals will be reviewed for timeliness, completeness, quality, experience and fiscal stability of applicant, reasonableness of costs. All applicants will receive notification regarding the decision made on their proposal.

Applicants must demonstrate the following:

- Understanding of SDP and the steps needed to transition into the program
- Understanding of Person-Centered Thinking
- Demonstrated training or skills for the proposed project
- A history of positive working relationships with the community and applicable agencies. If the applicant is a current vendor, the applicant must be in good standing with the Inland Regional Center.
- Experience in project development, including the ability to complete projects, meet project deadlines and manage a project of this size and scope.

Evaluation of proposals and vote by Committee begins: September 26, 2024

Notice of selection: By October 28, 2024

Awardees must submit project updates during the IRC LVAC meetings and a final report on overall success in meeting project outcomes is required.

Submission of proposals:

All proposals must conform to the Project Specific Questions and General Application Questionnaire requirements. The applicant must submit the completed proposal as one electronic copy to selfdetermination@inlandrc.org. The proposals must be complete, typewritten, collated, and page numbered. No proposals will be accepted after the deadline.
