Deaf+ Day Program	Funding to develop a new type of fully integrated day program for the Deaf+ community in Riverside County. This program will promote and offer a full range of support including but not limited to communication skills, employment/volunteer assistance and vocational training for Deaf Plus consumers. IRC hopes to surround these consumers with staff they can adequately communicate with to strive to meet their desire to connect with their community and enhance their independence. IRC will work with a current-day program with knowledge to empower individuals within the Deaf Plus community that we serve. Transportation will be a component of the program as well.	\$200,000.00
Deaf+ Parent Advocacy Support Group	Funding to create parent advocacy/support group for families or caregivers of Deaf + individuals. The provider will conduct outreach and coaching to parents of individuals with developmental disabilities, with a focus on the Deaf Plus community. Groups will be held by a licensed individual, using ASL, covering topics such as how to empower consumers to request services to meet IPP goals, understanding latest technology advancements and navigating available resources. IRC will partner with the provider to develop various group sessions to connect and educate them in areas such as education, public services, and exploring various services to ensure that they feel services are accessible and inclusive.	\$200,000.00
